your tremendous work on behalf of SEATA and our profession and it is wonderful to see you recognized for it. I also want to extend congratulations to our SEATA Scholarships Winners, who are listed later in this *Newsletter*. On a related note, we very much appreciate the outstanding work of **Janet Passman**, who is stepping down as chair of the SEATA Scholarship Committee. The Committee has made significant progress under her direction in recent years.

NATA counsel presented oral arguments before the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals on March 7, 2006, and asked a three-judge panel to let NATA's lawsuit against CMS proceed in Federal District Court. The Court has granted an expedited appeal, and NATA now awaits a decision. We are also pursuing this issue legislatively and you can help in many ways such as letter writing as directed through eBlasts and the NATA website. This issue will ultimately affect every athletic trainer in every setting. Additionally, we all need to obtain our National Provider Identifier (NPI) number as detailed later in this edition and on the SEATA website.

We appreciate all of you who participated in the recent election and I particularly want express thanks for your overwhelming support of continuing the annual dues contribution to the NATA Research and Education Foundation. Your support is critical in enabling the Foundation to continue their mission the research and education aspect our profession.

The license renewal deadline is September 30, 2006. All practicing athletic trainers must have operating protocols signed by a physician, be current in CPR, and first aid and must have completed a medical errors and HIV/AIDs course at the time of renewal. Each applicant must also have completed 24 continuing education units within the biennium.
